New gold refinery opens

 Vice-President demands responsible gold sourcing

HE first gold refinery in which the state holds a stake has been commissioned to facilitate a new

vision of adding value to a significant portion of the country's gold.

With capacity to refine 400 kilogrammes of dore gold (raw gold) per day or 132 tonnes of 24 carat, 99.99 per cent pure gold annually, the Royal Ghana Gold Refinery (RGGR) can process the entire volume of the gold exported from Ghana within 300 working days and process others from neighbouring countries.

It is a public, private partnership (PPP) between the Bank of Ghana, which took over
