

Speaker's declaration on 4 MPs:

Supreme Court ruling binding on Parliament

• Legal experts tell NDC Caucus

LEGAL experts have emphasised the need to obey the rulings of the Supreme Court and all courts, even if parties are of the opinion that they are wrong, unlawful or unconstitutional.

Such a position, they

said, was the foundation of the legal system, which was meant to prevent the country from descending into chaos and anarchy.

They have, therefore, called on the National Democratic Congress (NDC) Caucus in Parliament to change its stance and rather take steps to set
