



Sexual health education more crucial

IN our society, many girls are known to have dropped out of school due to pregnancy. While they stay out of school to have their babies and nurture them, their male mates, some of them, responsible for such pregnancies, are able to move on with their lives because they are not biologically saddled with such responsibility.

To worsen the plight of such mothers, they are often not able to return to the classroom because they do not get the needed family support, no matter how intelligent they are.

Added to this, their homes are often hostile because parents and other family members are disappointed. They are often seen as an embarrassment to the family and not many parents are willing to cater for the baby to enable the mother return to school.

Some of such mothers would also not want to go near a classroom once they realise they are pregnant because of how their mates and some teachers will make fun of them. In many cases, both mothers and their babies are not able to develop to the benefit of society due to the lack of proper education,

That is why The Mirror finds it remarkable, that a pregnant Basic Education Certificate Examination (BECE) candidate last Thursday reported at her examination centre at Sokode-Etoe, near Ho in the Volta Region, to write her last paper which was Integrated Science. (see story on page 4)

Even though she could not finish writing and had to be rushed to a nearby health facility to be delivered of her baby, the Ho Municipal Examinations Coordinator, Fridoline Dedume, has indicated that she would be graded in that paper on the basis of her continuous assessment in school.

The Mirror admires the courage of this girl who obviously knows the value of education and was, therefore, determined to finish her

While we wish mother and baby well, we appeal to her family to offer her the needed support to enable her to return to the classroom to continue with her studies

The Mirror observes that the lack of sexual health education which seems a taboo in many homes is a contributory factor to teenage pregnancy in addition to the lack of proper care and supervision of the girl child.

Even though abstinence before marriage is the ideal, it is clear that teaching both girls and boys how to prevent pregnancy in order to reduce the many cases of teenage pregnancy and the problems associated with it, has become more imperative than before.
